The Christian Worldview Biblical

A Biblical worldview is defined as:

- 1. Believing that absolute moral truths exist;
- 2. that such truth is defined by the Word of God;
- 3. that Jesus Christ lived a sinless life as the Redeemer of all mankind and He is the <u>only</u> Way to heaven;
- 4. God is the all-powerful and all-knowing Creator of the universe and He stills rules it today;
- 5. salvation is a gift from God and <u>cannot</u> be earned;
- 6. Satan and Hell are real;
- 7. a Christian is called to proclaim the Gospel of Jesus Christ to others; and,
- 8. the Bible is 100% accurate in <u>all</u> of its teachings.

I'm A Christian!

69% of American adults self-identify as Christian! They do embrace many basic tenets of the **Biblical worldview. Yet,** most hold to views that are in direct conflict with the teachings of God's **Holy Word!**





Of the 69% who self-identify as Christian, only 9% actually possess a **Biblical** worldview!

Yet a segment of Christians known as "Integrated **Disciples**" consisting of only 6% hold to the Biblical worldview and demonstrate a consistent understanding and application of Biblical principles!

So, they say that they are Christians! These include the broadest spectrum of theological viewpoints. Here's what they believe:

- 79% believe that God has a reason for everything
- > 77% say they have a unique, God-given calling
- 74% say they intentionally try to avoid sinning, since they know it hurts God!
- 72% claim that every moral choice either honors or dishonors God
- 62% agree that the universe was designed, created and sustained by God
- > 61% believe God is all-knowing, all-powerful, perfect and just.

- > 57% believe in karma (destiny or fate, following as effect from cause)
- 52% claim that moral truth is up to the individual; there is NO moral absolutes that apply to everyone, at all times!

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So what's the Problem?!

These "Christians" reject these teachings of God:

- + Marriage is between ONE man and ONE woman (46%);
- + believe they will go to heaven... (40%)
- + they are born in sin and can only be saved by the atoning death of Jesus Christ (34%)
- + believes that pre-marital sex is morally unacceptable (sexual immorality) (32%)
- + believes that obedience to God leads to a successful life (28%)

This is the group that calls themselves born-again Christians! Note that they are about half of the total population of those who say they are Christians. Here's what they believe:

- > 78% believe that marriage is between ONE man & ONE woman
- 77% say that having faith matters more than which faith you pursue
- 72% believe that God is all-knowing, all-powerful, perfect/just
- 69% consider feelings, experience, or input from family and friends their most trusted source of moral guidance
- > 65% say there is NO moral truth
- 60% believe that God's Word is accurate and reliable

- > 31% believe that the Bible is ambiguous concerning abortion

- > 88% believe that God has a reason for everything

There is a small minority, however, whose beliefs are in direct opposition to God's Holy Word:

- 52% believe people are basically good
- > 42% say that having faith matters more than which faith you pursue
- 39% believe that the Holy Spirit is NOT a real, living being but merely a symbol of God's power, presence, or purity!
- > 33% believe in karma (destiny or fate, following as effect from cause)
- 25% claim that moral truth is up to the individual; there is NO moral absolutes that apply to everyone, at all times!
- > 9% claim that all religious faiths are equal in value
- > 8% believe the Bible is ambiguous concerning abortion
- 5% believe that if a person is good enough, does good things, <u>they can earn</u> their way into heaven
- 4% consider feelings, experience, or input from family and friends their most trusted source of moral guidance

It's one thing to call yourself a fan of a sports team or a devotee of a particular brand. It's something else altogether to call yourself by the Name of the Savior of humankind (your LORD and King!).

Jesus spoke to this issue during His Sermon on the Mount. He rebuked those who claimed to be one of His followers: ²¹"Not everyone who says to me, 'Lord, Lord,' will enter the kingdom of heaven, but the one who does the will of my Father who is in heaven. ²²On that day many will say to me, 'Lord, Lord, did we not prophesy in your name, and cast out demons in your name, and do many mighty works in your name?' ²³And then will I declare to them, 'I never knew you; depart from me, you workers of lawlessness." [St. Matthew 7:21-23, NKJV]

<u>Obedience</u> is of paramount importance to Jesus. He noted that a person would be His disciple if they <u>obey His</u> <u>teachings</u> (John 8:31). It follows, then, that when a person claims to be a "Christian" it refers to one who is striving to know and follow the teachings and example of Jesus Christ.

That's not always the case in contemporary America, as the Cultural Research Center data credibly demonstrates, "Too often, it seems, people who are simply religious, or regular churchgoers, or perhaps people who want a certain reputation or image embrace the label 'Christian,' regardless of their spiritual life and intentions" explained George Barna, the lead researcher at the Cultural Research Center. "Christian" has become somewhat of a generic term rather than a name that reflects a deep commitment to passionately pursuing and being like Jesus Christ.

Thus, saith the LORD! "If anyone desires to come after Me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross, and follow Me. ²⁵For whoever desires to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for My sake will find it. ²⁶For what profit is it to a man if he gains the whole world, and loses his own soul? Or what will a man give in exchange for his Soul? [St. Matt. 16:24-26, NKJV]
