<u>Trinity Twenty-five</u> The One Who Endures to the End Will Be Saved

You must use your ears, and not your eyes, since God's kingdom is one of faith, and faith comes by hearing the Word of Christ. The people of Israel, however, wanted to walk not by faith, but by sight. Israel was stiff-necked and hard hearted. After many warnings the northern ten tribes were taken into captivity in 722 BC by the Assyrians. Those ten tribes disappeared. No one knows what became of them. Then, after many further warnings, the southern two tribes were taken to Babylon in 606-5 BC. Many of the people repented and were allowed to return seventy years later. But again the people proved to be impenitent.

Finally the Savior came unto His own, but His own received Him not. God became a man and tried again and again to call the covenant people to repentance. Most of them refused. Even after Jesus ascended into heaven God granted the covenant people another forty years of grace. But then the time of mercy ended.

During the years 66 to 70 AD, God sent Roman legions to Jerusalem and Jerusalem was utterly destroyed. The covenant people were scattered to the four corners of the earth. Though they can still be saved, their former glory is gone. What a warning for all men, especially for Christians!

Upon such faithless and false worshipers God's judgment comes. Only on the Last Day will our faith be turned to sight. "For as the lightning comes from the east and shines as far as the west, so will be the coming of the Son of Man" (St. Matt. 24:27). The Lord Himself will descend from heaven with a shout, and He will gather His people to Himself, both the living and the dead (1 Thess. 4:13-18). In a world in which our days are few and full of trouble (Job 14:1), let us comfort one another with these words of the Resurrection and the Return of our Lord Jesus.

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NOTE ON PARTICIPATING IN THE LORD'S SUPPER

As intended by Christ and as practiced by the one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church throughout history, "closed communion" is observed here, in which the Lord's Supper is distributed only to those who:

(a) are baptized in the Name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit;

(b) have been instructed in the truth of Holy Scriptures as taught in the Lutheran Confessions, have been confirmed in this Lutheran faith and practice, and now embrace this same Lutheran faith in the same way that it is believed, taught, confessed, and practiced in this congregation;

(c) believe that in this Sacrament the real Body and Blood of Christ are truly distributed to them and orally received by them, bestowing on them the forgiveness of sins, life and salvation;

(d) repent of all their sins, and desire to receive God's forgiveness in this holy meal.

Guests at our services who are able to affirm these facts should speak to our pastor or the elder on duty before receiving the Sacrament. To other guests with us today, we express to you our sincere interest, friendship, and concern, and we assure you that it is for the spiritual welfare of all that we practice closed communion. Those desiring to learn more about our beliefs are asked to speak with our pastor.
